Course Description	:	
<p>This course introduces students to Intellectual Property (IP) Law in general and its two common categories: Industrial Property (mostly patents) and Copyright. Thus, the programme covers all the major IP rights in Indonesia and the regulation, including copyright, designs, trade marks, and patents as well as confidentiality or trade secret, plant variety rights, layout desain of integrated circuit and other IP protection.The course provides an overview of the main principles and legal rules of IP Law, focusing specifically on the theoretical and practical connections between IP and academic/scientific works/studies and on the IP issues with which the students are likely to come into contact in their different areas of knowledge. The course explain also the ownership of intellectual property rights and Rights resulting from intellectual property rights, infringement of intellectual property rights and free use of intellectual property rights.The programme also addresses national policy-making including the global policy and the framework of international treaties that govern intellectual property law, as well as consideration of IP rights in their social, cultural and commercial contexts. The course also covers the current issue of protection local or traditional property, including traditional knowledge, genetic resources and cultural expression.</p>

The right (facilities, protection, and legal guarantee) and the responsibility of investors become also the subject matter discussed.
